Similar schemes in other areas have shown a reduction in average speeds of between 1-2 mph, as a result of the introduction of 20mph limits Accident Numbers and Severity Research by the Transport Research Laboratory (TRL) shows that a 1mph reduction in average speed results in approximately 6% reduction in collisions on urban roads

Updated Guidelines for the Design and Application of Speed ...

A speed hump is a raised area in the roadway pavement surface extending transversely across the travel way Speed humps are sometimes referred to as "pavement undulations" or "sleeping policemen" Most agencies implement speed humps with a height of 3 to 35 inches (76 to 90 mm) and a travel length of 12 to 14 feet (37 to 43 m)
