Theory Z Theory Z was not developed by McGregor In his book 'Theory Z: How American management can Meet the Japanese Challenge' William Ouchi (1981) first presented this theory Theory Z is often referred to as the 'Japanese' management style (sometimes also called the "Gung Ho or Samurai mode)
