Poverty is not simply the absence of financial resources According to Amartya Sen, poverty is the lack of capability to function effectively in society Inadequate education can thus be considered a form of poverty Absolute poverty - the absence of adequate resources - hampers learning in developing

and effects of poverty and inequality are complex and multi-dimensional, and require a range of interventions and responses These must address the underlying causes of poverty, not just the symptoms Poverty is about much more than a lack of income Evidence tells us that factors such as the quality of a child's home learning
