What is a Statutory Nuisance? A statutory nuisance is defined under the Environmental Protection Act 1990 as any of the following that has been assessed by an Environmental Health Practitioner as being “prejudicial to health or a nuisance” any premises in such a state smoke emitted from a premises fumes or gases emitted from a private
